Whereas several quantities of lands in the Province of Pennsylvania by reason of untrue surveyes are liable to be resurveyed for discov^{ry} & disposal of y^e plus thereof to such as I shall think fit,
And also that divers quantities of Lands are not settled according to some former Regulations made by me, whereby part thereof become liable to be disposed of to others that will settle thereupon: yet for as much as I judge it not convenient that any lands should be resurveyed either for the plus or for want of settlement without a special warrant from myself.

These are therefore to will and require thee not to survey or cause to be surveyed any lands as aforesd upon any pretence or warrant whatsoever, nor to make any Returns for any person whatsoever into y^e Secretary's Office in order to obtain Patent for the same untill further Order from me and this shall be thy warrant.
