Whereas y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary hath by his strict ord<sup>rs</sup> to us fforbidden all Resurveys to be granted or overplus Lands to be disposed to any without his express order for y<sup>e</sup> same wee doe hereby signifie y<sup>e</sup> same to thee, and Require that thou hast a speciall regard to preserve y<sup>e</sup> Proprietarys Property & Right therein; and whereas by y<sup>e</sup> advice of y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary wee are given to understand that his Daughter Letitia's Land ~~the~~ <sup>along</sup> the River <sup>side is</sup> ~~is~~ <sup>is</sup> incroached upon or devoured quite by W<sup>m</sup> Lowthers the w<sup>ch</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary Commands shall be Rectified & not such a slant as was sent over by y<sup>e</sup> mapp to be endured, the w<sup>ch</sup> thou art hereby ordered fforthwith to Rectifie and enlarge. And ffor as much as y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary is given to understand that between Doct<sup>r</sup> Cox's and Sam<sup>l</sup> Buckleys land upon y<sup>e</sup> Scholkill-there is about eighteen hundred acres of land y<sup>e</sup> w<sup>ch</sup> land together with y<sup>e</sup> said Sam<sup>l</sup> Buckleys land, and all the Land thereunto Contiguous w<sup>ch</sup> was laid out ffor Charles Pick, herin in whose right soever y<sup>e</sup> warr<sup>ts</sup> were granted was a very irregular Survey and ~~be~~ fore not be allowed off whereupon he doth will and require thee fforthwith to survey or cause to be surveyd and laid out y<sup>e</sup> said Sam<sup>l</sup> Buckleys and Charles Pickerin's Land together with y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid eighteen hundred acres of land unto y<sup>e</sup> Proprietarys Mannour of Petheorn<sup>a</sup> off all w<sup>ch</sup> Premises thou art hereby required to make speedy execution and returne y<sup>e</sup> same to y<sup>e</sup> Secretarys office. Given at Philadelphia the eleventh day of y<sup>e</sup> third month 1688.
