



This Tract surveyed to Yurey Bess in behalf of William Allen. Beginning at a marked hickrey standing by the side of the West Branch of Dalawar-then southeast thirty pearch to a heap of stones then northeast twenty-two pearch to a black oak, then southeast fourty four pearches to a whit-oak by vacand land then northeast an hundred and sixty pearches to a post then north west twenty pearches to a post then north north east two hundred and sixty fower pearches by vacand land to a heap of stones then northwest fourty pearches to a linden tree by the side of the west branch of Dalawar-then upp the several courses of the saim to the place of begining containing two hundred and thirteen acres surveyed in the year 1736
