



Surveyed this tract of land to William Allen upon the West Branch of Dalaar-below Moors place begining at a marked ches not standing by the side of the said Branch then south east Thre hundred and fourty perche by vacant land to a black oak marked then northeast one hundred and thirty-eight perches to a black oak then north sixty-nine degres east two hundred and six perches to another black oak then northeast eighty-eight perche to a heap of stons then southeast one hundred and seventy perche to a post by the sid- of the west branch all by vacant land then upp the sevral corses of the said branch to the place of begining, containing five hundred acres of land with usual allowance for Roads surveyed in Bucks County on the 14 day of the 7 month in the yeare 1733
