By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Ralph Sutton late of the County of Bucks that we would grant him to take up at or near Oley the quantity of two hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees eight & twenty pounds money of Pennsylvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres.

These are to authorize and require ^{thee} to survey or cause to be survey'd unto ye said Ralph Sutton at the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said Ralph fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
