



A Draught of a tract of land situate in the Manor of Springtown in the County of Chester now in the possession of John Jack, beginning at a stone a corner of Thomas Brown's land and from thence extending along a line of the said Manor East 86 perches to a stone thence by John Elliot's land N. 29° W. 83 perches to a marked hickery, thence by the same and land of John Starret N. 2° W. 112 perches to a post thence by the said John Starret's land N. 81 1/2° W. 22 perches to a corner in Indian Creek thence by Thomas Brown's land S. 2° E. 47 perches to a small black oak marked, S. 74° W. 53 perches to a stone and S. 14° E. 131 perches to the place of beginning containing sixty six acres and 113 perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed by direction of the Honourable the Proprietaries the 29th day of September 1753.
