

Pennsylvania 5s.

By virtue of a Warrant dated the 31st day of December 1733 there was surveyed to the use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a certain tract of land situate in Calm Township in the County of Chester, beginning at a marked white oak in a line of James Gibbons's land and from thence extending by the same and Springtown Manor South East by South two hundred and sixty eight perches to a post thence by the said Springtown Manor East two hundred and seventy three perches to a post thence by John White's land North by West one hundred and sixty three perches to a post and East eighty perches to a marked white oak thence by John Taylor's land North twenty degrees West three hundred and twenty three perches to a marked white oak thence by vacant land and land of John Adams South West by West four hundred and thirty three perches to the place of beginning containing seven hundred and seventy two acres and the usual allowance of six acres. $\frac{1}{4}$ Cent for Roads &c^a
