By vertue of a warrant to me directed bearing date ye 7-1th 1701 I have surv^d and layed out unto John Guest of Philadelphia Bent. ^{in ye Nottingham} A tract of land on Otteraro Creek at a bounded white oak standing at the mouth of a Run or branch on the Est side of Otteraro Creek & by ye sd Creek opposit- to the Shauoblinees Indian Town thence by a line South 229 1/2 pch to a bounded black oak being a bounded tree of Edward Besons land thence by his line Est 425 perch- to a bounded black — thenc-North 469 1/2 pch to a bounded white oak standing south side of a Creek caled Stony Creek thence down the sd Creek to the mouth thereof to Otteraro Creek then down Otteraro Creek to the first mentioned bounded tree containing and surveyed for 980 acres of land ye 13-day of ye 3^d month 1702
