At the Request of Thomas Story Attorney for Joseph Pike of the Kingdom of Ireland Merch^t That we would Grant him to take up the Remainder ~~of~~ not yet take up or Granted of five thousand Acres of Land purchased by the sd Joseph Pike of Samuel Rolls Original Purchaser of the Said quantity from the Proprietary These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey to the sd Joseph Pike according to the Method of Townships appointed Seven Hundred Acres of Land that hath not been already survey'd ^{in part of the Said Remainder} nor taken up, nor is Concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and make Returns in the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delv'd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 30th day of November 1702
