At the Request of John Salkeld Attorney for Richard Pike That I would grant him to take up for ye sd Rich^d five hundred Acres of Land in right of Ralph Crispin Purchaser of ye sd quantity Acres. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd ^{to} the Said Richard Pike the said Number of five hundred Acres of Land not already Survey'd nor taken up nor conceal'd nor seated by the Indians, according to the Method of Townships by me appointed and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 27th of ye 7th Moth 1701
