 aforesd according to the Method of Townships the Said Number  
 of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province That has not  
 been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor  
 seated by the Indians and make Returns into the General  
 Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain  
 and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by ye Secretary  
 Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup>  
 the Sixth of the 2<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1702


