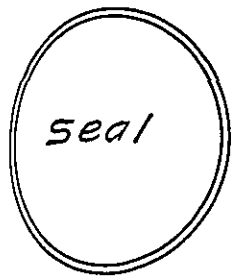


Pensilvania Ss.

At the request of John Shiers first purchaser of one thousand acres of land to be laid out in this Province that we would grant him to take up four hundred and eighty ^{four} acres the remainder of his said purchase.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said John Shiers according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of four hundred and eighty ^{four} acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office in order to a further confirmation.

Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the 3^d month Anno Dni 1715.
