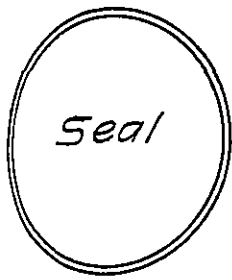

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r
in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Coun-
ties annexed.

Whereas by my ord^r to my Comm^{rs} of Property bearing date the 15th day of ye fifth month 1686, I granted to Theodore Siepman in right of Govert Ramkes purchaser of one thousand acres of land one third part of an acre in some convenient street in the City Philad^{ia} in pursuance of w^{ch} ord^r my said Comm^{rs} granted a Warr^t bearing date the 15th of the 12th month 1688 directed to Tho. Holme to lay out the said third part of an acre of land in the City Philad^{ia} in some convenient street thereof, not interfering with the first purchasers right and make returns thereof into my Secretaries office.

Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 25th day of ye 2^d month 1701.
