At the Request of One Shard That we would grant him to take up fifty Acres of Land in Consideration that he came into this Province in the year 1682 a Servant to Thomas Brassey and according to custom Served him four years for which the Said quantity of Land is by ye Proprietors Concessions due to him to be held under the Yearly Rent of one half penny Sterl^o Acre. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the sd One Shard according to the Method of Townships the Said quantity of fifty Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the tenth day of December 1712.
