Inclosed you have a Draught of a tract of land situate in Tulpehocken township Lancaster County, about 75 acres of was surveyed the 21st day of June 1739 the next was added this summer. The why I mention this is that as I beleive there has no Warrant yet issued for it, the Seretary may perhaps make some allowance as to interest and quitrent when he issues a Warrant for accepting the survey. The land is realy poor and serves only for an addition to his Plantation which is part of the land claimed by M^r Abraham Taylor. But this I mention with submission.

I long to hear of M^r Biddle's success at the Election.
