These are to authorize and require thee forthwith to survey and lay out ~~to the said T. Sowle the~~ according to the method of townships appointed the said number of five hundred acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this Warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd. to thee certified by the Secretary.
