



William Penn Proprietary and Govern^t in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties annexed.

At the request of Daniel Street that I would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in right of John West purchaser of twelve hundred and fifty acres who by his last will devised the same to his grandchildren the children of Hannah his daughter Psent wife of ye sd Daniel _____

These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd according to ye method of townships by me appointed ^{to} the said Daniel Street for the uses of the sd will the said number of acres of land in this Province not already survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by ye Indians & make returns thereof into my Secretaries office.
