At the request of Thomas Story that we would grant him to take up all those vacant lots lying between the Western end of the lott formerly granted to Matthias Van Bebber and Vine street on the third street from Delaware, also those vacant lots lying between the sd Vine street to the south and Joseph Willcox's Ropewalk to the North and Wm^m Wills lotts at the North end of the town to the East and the sd third street continued beyond the town on the West for which he has agreed to pay ^{for a yearly quitrent} after the rate of one english shilling for every £ ten foot in breadth on the said third street.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the said Thomas Story the said vacant lotts under the bounds and limits aforesaid and make returns into the Gen^l Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 20th of the 3^d moth 1706.
