Whereas by Order and Direction of the Honorable Proprietaries, there was surveyed unto Thomas Craig, Hugh Wilson, John Jones, Thomas Armstrong and James Martin a certain Lot of Ground situate in the Town of Easton, in the County of Northampton, thereon to erect a Court House and Prison for the Public Service of the said County, marked in the Plan of the said Town Number ninety six.

Now in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 9th Day of July, 1762 requiring me to accept into my Office the said Survey of the said Lot of Ground, and to make Return thereof into the Secretaries Office in Order for Confirmation to the said Trustees for the Use of s^d, I do hereby certify the said Lot to be situate in the said Town of Easton & on the East Side of Pomfret Street, containing in Breadth North & South (obl.) five feet 8c in Length East & West two hundred and forty feet. Bounded Northward by a Twenty feet Alley, Eastward by another Twenty feet Alley, Southward by Lot Number Ninety eight and Westward with Pomfret Street Aforesaid: - Returned into the Secretaries Office the 9th day of July, 1762.


Lot for ye
