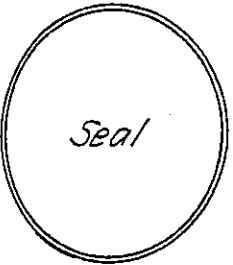

At the Request of James Logan That We would Grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in right of Jm<sup>o</sup> Geary of Dunsloe in the County of Hertford Purchaser of the said quantity of the Proprietor by Original Deeds dated y<sup>e</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> dayes of April 1682 These are to Authorize and Require thee to lay out to y<sup>e</sup> said James Logan according to the Method of Townships appointed (Deducting the Liberty Land) the Said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is conceald nor seated by the Indians And make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & the Provincial Seal at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> called June 1712
