170 perches to a Corner marked black oak standing neare the old line of  
another tract Called Wickaco from thence S by E. by a line of marked trees. 290  
perch to a Corner marked white oak standing on the side of Delaware. from  
thence up by S<sup>d</sup> Rivobl N by E. and NNE 210 perches to the first mentioobl  
spanish oak Containning 345 acres of farobl land*
