Whereas in and by an act of General Assembly of this Province Intituled "An Act of Erecting the North West Part of Bucks into a seperate County" which in and by said Act is Called Northampton, and Thomas Craig, Hugh Wilson, John Jones, Thomas Armstrong, & James Martin, or any three of them were Appointed Trustees, to purchase and Take Assurance to them and Their Heirs, of a Piece of Land Situate in some Convenient Place in the Town of Easton, in the said County, and thereon to Erect and Build a Court House and Prison Sufficient to accomodate the Publick Service of the said County, as in and by the said Act Appears &c^a:

Now in pursuance of a warrant Dated the 9th day of July, 1762, I have caused a survey to be made for the said Trustees, on a Certain Lot of Ground Situate in the Center of the Great Square in the town of Easton Containing in Length North and South Eighty feet, & in Breadth East & West Eighty feet. Returned into the Secretaries Office the 5th day of June, 1764.
