


FORM No. 1.



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors Dated the twenty third Day of April 1730 Surveyed and laid out for Caspar Wistar a Certain Tract of Land situate near Moxatauny on a Branch of Delaware River Beginning at a Black Oak about six pches Eastward from the sd Branch Thence extending South 69 Degrees East 428 pches to a White Oak Thence North 21 Degrees East 74 pches to a white oak Thence South 69 Degrees East 86 pches to a Black Oak Thence South 21 Degrees West 234 pches to a White Oak Thence North 69 West 305 pches to a Hickory Thence North 21 East 45 pches to a White Oak Thence North 69 Degrees West 209 pches to a Post Thence North 21 Deg<sup>s</sup> East 115 pches to the place of Beginning, being Bounded on all Sides by vacant Land. Containing Four hundred & sixty seven Acres besides the allowance of 6 p. Cent.
