



Pursuant to an order from the Surveyor General Surveyed and Laid out for John Jones a Tract of Land Scituate in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a Chesnut Oak in the line of John Pennis Mannour thence by Vact Land North West Two hundred sixty Nine perches to a Large Black oak thence by Vact Land South forty Degrees west one hundred and Sixty perches to a White oak Thence South East one hundred Eighty Nine perches by Vact land thence South forty Degrees west by Vact Land one hundred <sup>& sixty</sup> perches thence South East Eighty perches to a post in the Said Mannour Line thence by the Same North forty degrees East Two hundred and Sixty perches to the place of begining containing three hundred Acres with allowance of six p Cent Surveyed June 6<sup>th</sup> 1724 p
