



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Society Trustees - - - -
 - - - Dated the fifteenth Day of February 1724^{1/2} Surveyed and
 laid out to W^m Branson a Tract of land Scituate in the County
 of Philad^a on a branch of Manahatanny Creek beginning at
 a Black oak being a corner of the Sweades Tract thence by
 the same South Twenty Degrees Westerly forty perches to a post
 thence by Vacant land South Seventy Degrees Easterly Sixty four
 perches to a hickery mark for a Corner thence North Twenty
 degrees Easterly One hundred and thirty perches to a post
 thence North Seventy degrees Westerly One Hundred and Sixty
 perches to a hickery thence South Seventy degrees Westerly Ninety
 perches to a post in the Said Sweades line thence by the Same South
 Seventy degrees Easterly Ninety Six perches to the place of beginning
 Containing One hundred Acres with Allowance of Six p Cent
 Survey July 27th 1725
