


FORM NO. 1.



In pursuance of a Warrant from the Trustees of the free Society of Traders dated the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February 1724/5 for Surveying to francis Rawl (since deceased) four hundred acres of land and by Order of the Sons of francis There was laid out to John Swift a certain parcel of land on a small branch of Susquehannah River in the County of Chester - Beginning at a White Oak stand- ing on the Top of a barren hill near a small Run thence west by North by Vacant land 100 perches to a Spanish oak Then North by East by Vacant land 170 perches to a post then East by South 100 perches to a post Then South by West 170 perches to the place of beginning Containing One hundred acres with allowance of six p.Cent

Surveyed the 13<sup>th</sup> of July 1728
