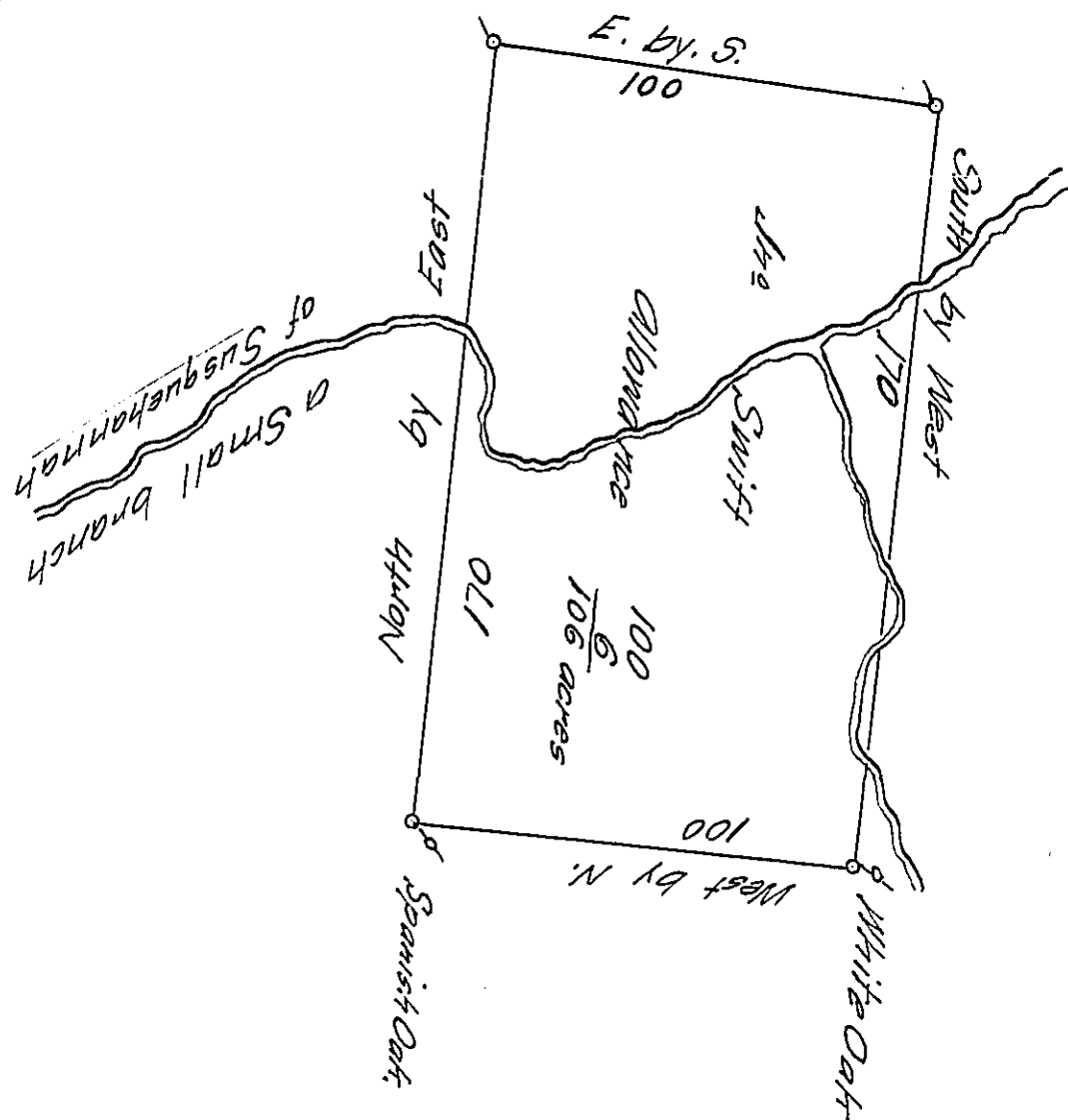


FORM No. 1.



In pursuance of a Warrant from the Trustees of the free Society of Traders dated the 15th day of February 1724^{1/2} for Surveying to Francis Rawl (since deceased) four hundred acres of land and by Order of the Sons of the Francis There was laid out to John Swift a certain parcel of land on a small branch of Susquehanna River in the County of Chester - Beginning at a White Oak standing on the Top of a barren hill near a small Run thence west by North by vacant land 100 perches to a Spanish oak Then North by East by vacant land 170 perches to a post then East by South 100 perches to a post Then South by West 170 perches to the place of beginning Containing One hundred acres with allowance of six p. Cent
