



By Order from the Surveyor Gen^l dated the 22^d of January 1728^{dy}
I Survey'd to John Swift A certain Tract of Land Situate on Pe-
quea Creek in the county of Lancaster

Begining at a Black Oak in a line of Samuel Buyer's Land
thence North by West 68 pches to a Black Oak by the sd Pequea
Creek then up the Same about 390 pches to a Spanish Oak
thence South five degrees Westerly by vacant Land 128 pches
to a post thence West North West by the sd Sam^l Buyer's Land
80 pches to the place of Begining Containing One hundred
acres and the allowance of Six acres for roads and differ-
ence of Surveys
