



By the Proprietors of the Province of Pennsylvania &c.

Upon an agreement now made with James Steel for and on behalf of Casper Wister of the City of Philadelphia for Sixteen hundred and fifty acres of Land to be laid out to him within the said Province. In consideration whereof We have received the sum of one hundred & eighty three Pounds Six Shillings & eight pence. Money of England in full Satisfaction for the same. These are therefore to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Casper Wister among the late Surveys made back in the said Province (in two or three parcels) according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Sixteen hundred & fifty acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians to be holden under the Yearly Quitrent of one shilling Sterling for every hundred acres thereof forever and make Returns into the Secretarys office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the said Province dated at London the 23^d day of April Anno Domini 1730
