



In pursuance of a Warrant from the Trustees of the free Society of Traders dated the 15th day of February 1724⁵ for surveying to Francis Rawle (since deceased) four hundred acres of Land and by Order of the sons of the sd Francis There was Laid out to John Swift a Certain parcel of Land Situate on a Small Branch of Susquehanna River in the County of Chester — Beginning at a White Oak Standing on the Top of a Barren Hill near a Small run thence West by North ^{by Vacant Land} 100 pches to a Spanish Oak thence North by East by Vacant Land 170 pches to a post thence East by South 100 pches to a post thence south by West 170 pches by Vacant Land to the place of Beginning Contain- ing one hundred acres With the allowance of Six acres for Roads & Highways ~ Surveyd the 13th 7^{mb} 1728.
