Whereas the members of the free Society of Traders in Pensilvania having purchased Twenty Thousand Acres of Land in this Province Our late proprietary and Govern^r William Penn Esq^r Grant^d ed them this Warrant dated the twenty sixth day of the Twelfth Month 1682 directed to then Survey^r Gen^l Requiring him to Cause the same to be Survey'd or Laid out to the s^d Society by Virtue Where of some part of the s^d Land was survey'd and the residue remains Unlocated And Whereas by an Act of Gen^l Assembly of this Province all the s^d Lands with the appurtenances are Vested and Settled in us as Trustees with power to sell the same for the Use of the s^d Society And we having sold Francis Rawle of the County of Philad^a Gen^t four hundred Acres of the s^d Unlocated Land and in pursuance of the Directions of the s^d Act of Assembly Have Settled and Adjusted in the Survey^r Gen^ls Office of this Province the true Account of the Lands already Survey'd and laid out in Right of the s^d Society and secured the payment of the arrears of Quitrents due for the same to the Proprietary of this province

These are therefore to request thee in pursuance of the affors^d Original Warrant of the s^d late Proprietary and by the Authority of the s^d Act of Gen^l Assembly to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the s^d Francis Rawle according to the Established & usual Methods heretofore practised for taking up of Lands in this Province and not otherwise the s^d quantity of four hundred acres and make return thereof into the Survey^r Gen^ls office Given under our hands and Seals at Philad^a the fifteenth day of February Anno Domⁱ 1724^{1/2}
