Pennsylvania, ss. —

By Virtue of a General Warrant to me directed bearing Date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1748 I have caused to be Surveyed on the 4<sup>th</sup> Day of November, 1751 for the use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land Situate on Delaware River formerly in the County of Bucks now in the County of Northampton. Beginning at a Black oak Stump on the bank of the said River & from thence extending by land of William Allen North twenty deg<sup>s</sup> west Seventy perches to a stone, thence by Cornelius Vanacres' Land North Seventy Degrees East seventy five perches to a marked white oak, and north one hundred and eighty nine perches to a marked Pine, thence by Vacant Land North fifty Degrees East one hundred and two perches to a very large stone, and North sixty seven perches to a stone, Thence by Johannes Cole's Land North eighty Degrees East forty perches to a Stone, and North twenty Degrees East fifty two perches to a marked upland Birch standing on the said Delaware River thence down the same on the several Courses thereof One hundred and thirty four perches to a marked Pine Tree, thence by Tunis Maddock's Land South eighty Degrees West fifty three perches to a Stone, ~~and~~ South ten Degrees East one hundred and six perches to a stone, South eighty Degrees West fifty three perches to a dead pine and South one hundred and ninety perches to a marked white oak, standing on the said Delaware River thence down the same on the several courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing Three hundred and ninety five Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres & Cent. for Roads &c<sup>a</sup>. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 23<sup>d</sup> day of December Anno Domini, 1754.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eleventh day of May, 1910.
