



By Virtue of a warrant from The Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietary and Governour  
 William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> bearing Date the 26<sup>th</sup> Day of the Twel<sup>ve</sup> Month 1682  
 granted to the members of the free Society of Traders in pensyl-  
vania to take up Twenty Thousand acres of Land: I have Surveyed  
 and Laid out unto John Warder of the City of Philadelphia Hatt  
 maker in the Township of \_\_\_\_\_ in the County of Lancaster  
 Ninety four acres of Land with allowance of six p Cent Beginning at  
 a Chestnut oak Thence South Ten Degrees Easterly sixty <sup>to a black oak</sup> pches Thence  
 North Sixty Eight Degrees Westerly fifty Eight pches to a White Oak  
 Thence North Thirty Degrees westerly One hundred and twenty six pches  
 to a Chestnut oak by Pawgus Creek Thence up the same Traversing the  
 severall Courses thereof near about one hundred and Ten pches to the  
 place of Beginning ~
