



N^o 3 By virtue of two Warrants from the Proprietors of the Province of Pennsylvania both dated the 23^d day of April 1730 for Surveying to Caspar Wister two thousand acres of land in this Province. There was surveyed in part the 22^d day of February 1730 a Tract of land on a branch of Schuylkill called Maxatavny Beginning at a small hickery at a corner of other land formerly laid out to the said Casper Thence by the same South ten degrees East two hundred perches to a post at another corner of his said other land Then North eighty degrees East one hundred and seven pches by the same land to a post. Then by vacant land as follows to say South ten degrees East ninety eight perches to a post South eighty degrees West two hundred thirty nine perches to a post North ten degrees West ninety two perches to a post South Eighty deg^s West Seventy eight perches North ten degrees West two hundred and six perches to a black Oak and North eighty degrees East two hundred and ten perches to the place of Beginning Containing three hundred eighty acres with allowance of Six p Cent
