



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors bearing Date the
twenty third Day of April 1730 There was Surveyed unto
Caspar Wistar a certain Tract of Land situate on a Branch of
Schoolkil — called Maxatawny in the County of Philadelphia
adjoining to other Land formerly Laid out to s^e Caspar Beginning
at a small Hickory at a Corner of s^e other Land Thence extending
by the same South ten Deg^o East two hundred p^s to a Post at another

Corner Thence North Eighty Deg^o East one hundred & seven p^s to a Post
Thence by Vacant Land as followeth South ten Deg^o East Ninety Eight p^s to a
Post South Eighty Deg^o West two hundred thirty nine p^s to a Post North ten
Deg^o West Ninety two p^s to a Post South Eighty Deg^o West seventy eight p^s to a
Post North ten Degrees West two hundred & six p^s to a black oak and North
Eighty Deg^o East two hundred and ten p^s to the place of Beginning
Containing Three hundred & Eighty Seven Acres & half an acre besides
the usual allowance of 6 p Cent. for Roads and Highways
