



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors Dated the twenty third day of April 1730. There was Surveyed unto Caspar Wister a Certain tract of Land situate on a Branch of Shoolkill called Maxatawny in the County of Philadelphia adjoining to other of se Caspar's Land Beginning at a Black oak a corner of other Land formerly laid out to se Caspar thence extending by the same North ten Deg^s West one hundred & forty eight pches to a post thence by Vacant Land as followeth to say North Eighty Deg^s East three hundred & fifteen pches to a post North ten Deg^s West seventy two pches to a Hick^{ed} North Eighty Deg^s East one hundred and sixty pches to a post South ten Deg^s East one hundred & thirty pches to a Hickery, North Eighty Deg^s East one hundred & twenty pches to a Chestnut South ten Deg^s East two hundred & thirteen pches to a Hickery, South Eighty Deg^s West one hundred & twenty pches to a post & North ten Deg^s West one hundred & twenty three pches to a small Hickery Thence by Vacant Land & se Caspar's other Land south Eighty Deg^s West four hundred & seventy five pches to the place of Beginning Containing Six hundred and thirty three Acres besides the Usual Allowance of Six p Cent for Roads & Highways
