Freame his Heirs and assigns One thousand Acres of the  
said Land in some one place, on Land purchased of the  
Indians and whereon no persons are Seated Reserving  
a Quitrent of twelve pence the Hundred Acres. Given under  
our hands and the Lesser Seal of the Said province, at  
London this 12<sup>th</sup> day of May 1732.*
