



John Penn, Thomas Penn & Richard Penn Esq^{rs} True and Absolute proprietors of the province of Pennsylvania and Counties of Newcastle Kent and Sussex on delaware, to Jacob Taylor Surveyor General, or to our Surveyor General for the time being.

Whereas Thomas Freame, of London Merchant hath purchased of us ten thousand Acres of Land in our said province of Pennsylvania. Wee do hereby Authorize and Require you to Survey or cause to be Surveyed, to him the said Thomas Freame his Heirs and Assigns One thousand Acres of the said Land in some one place, on Land purchased of the Indians, and whereon no persons are Seated Reserving a Quitrent of twelve pence the Hundred Acres. Given under our hands and the Lesser Seal of the said province, at London this 12th day of May, 1732.
