Whereas Thomas Freame of London Merchant hath purchased
 of us ten thousand Acres of Land in our said province of Penn-
sylvania, Wee do hereby Authorize and Require you to Survey
 or cause to be Surveyed to him the said Thomas Freame his
 Heirs and Assigns One thousand Acres of the said Land in
 some one place on Land purchased of the Indians and
 whereon no persons are Seated. Reserving a Quitrent of
 twelve pence the Hundred Acres, Given under our hands
 and the Lesser Seal of the said province, at London this
 12th day of May 1732.
