 chased of us ten thousand Acres of Land in our said  
 province of pennsylvania. Wee do hereby Authorize and Re-  
 quire you to Survey, or cause to be Surveyed, to him the said  
 Thomas Freame his Heirs and Assigns, One thousand Acres  
 of the said Land in some one place, on Land purchased  
 of the Indians, and whereon no persons are seated Reserv-  
 ing a Quitrent of twelve pence, the Hundred Acres. Given  
 under our hands and the Lesser Seal of the said province.  
 at London this 12<sup>th</sup> day of May. 1732.
