Upon the Settlement of Lawrence Grounds Acc<sup>t</sup> of Lands &c.  
a Warr<sup>t</sup> was granted him on the 24<sup>th</sup> of 9<sup>br</sup> 1737 for 424<sup>a</sup> w<sup>ch</sup> as matters were  
then understood would compleat his quantity, but since that time a Deed is  
found that takes away from him 106 acres of what was deemed Lawrence's  
share near Potquessin, in lieu whereof another Warr<sup>t</sup> will be granted to  
Lawrence for 106<sup>a</sup> & allo. but James Steel not being yet returned from <sup>rent</sup> it  
cannot be had to day, in the mean time I desire thee to lay out to him  
106<sup>a</sup> &c. more than the quant<sup>y</sup> mentioned in the Warr<sup>t</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> and  
a Copy of another Warr<sup>t</sup> shall be sent thee as soon as the original  
comes to my hand —
