Pennsylvania, ss. -

By virtue of a General Warrant bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> day of January 1734/5 there was surveyed on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1738 to the use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land Situate in the Forks of Delaware River formerly in the County of Bucks now in the County of Northampton Beginning at a small white oak marked a corner of James Bingham's Land and from thence extending by the same West Three hundred and twenty perches to a marked Hickery and south thirty two perches to a post. Thence by Thomas Greame's Land West three Hundred and three perches to a post. thence by William Allen's Land and Land of Casper Wister North three hundred and forty seven perches to a post, Thence by Vacant Land North eighty nine Degrees East Six hundred and twenty three perches to a small black oak marked, and south Two hundred and thirty perches to the place of Beginning Containing One thousand two hundred and twenty three Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres & Cent. for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 26<sup>th</sup> Day of December, Anno Dom. 1754.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eleventh day of May, 1910.
