

Pennsylvania, ss:—

By virtue of a General Warrant to me directed bearing Date the 25th Day of November, 1748 I have caused to be Surveyed on the 20th day of July, 1752 for the use of the Honble the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land Situate on the Lake Paupunaurning beyond the Blue Mountains a -
 bout Twenty Miles from Easton in the County of Northampton Beginning at a marked Spanish oak a corner of Nicholas Koontz's Land & from thence extending by the same and vacant Land North East Three hundred and forty perches to a stone, thence by Jacob Meisters' Land south East sixty one perches to a post, thence by Vacant Land South one hundred and thirty six perches to a stone Thence by Nicholas Weeser's Land South Seventy five Degrees West one hundred and thirty one perches to a stone, & South West One hundred and thirty perches to a Post, Thence by the said Nicholas Koontz's Land North west ninety one Perches and three quarters of a perch @bl the Place of Beginning. Containing Two hundred & fifteen Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres & Cent. for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretary's office the 23^d Day of December, Anno Dom: 1754.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eleventh day of May, 1910.
