

Pennsylvania, ss:-

By Virtue of a General Warrant bearing Date the 14<sup>th</sup> Day of November, 1741 there was surveyed on the tenth Day of November, 1742 for the use of the Honourable the Proprietaries a Certain Tract of Land situate in Saucon Township formerly in the County of Bucks now in the County of Northampton, Beginning at a marked black oak in a line of Benjamin Gaman's Land and from thence extending by the same south eighty Degrees East Seventy five perches to a post, thence by Samuel Newcomer's Land south eighty seven perches to a small Hickery marked, South seventy nine Degrees East ninety seven Perches to a marked black oak Sapling, and North fifty four Perches to a post, thence by Henry Weavers' Land East thirty five Perches to a post, thence by Land of Thomas and John Blackledge South one hundred & ninety one perches to a post and South West sixty Perches to a post thence by Land of Samuel Newcomer and Benjamin Gaman North west one hundred and ninety perches to a marked black oak Sapling and South west seventy nine perches to a post thence by Land of John Burk North West one hundred and two perches to a post. Thence by Joseph Samuel's Land North East thirty four perches to a post and North West thirty three perches to a stone thence by William Murrey's Land North East one hundred and forty two perches to the Place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred and Eighty four Acres and the usual allowance of six Acres  $\frac{1}{4}$  for Roads &c<sup>o</sup>. Returned into the Secretarys Office the 26<sup>th</sup> Day of December, 1754.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eleventh day of May, 1910.
