William Penn Esqr. by John Snashold late of Thakeham in the County of Sussex in Great Britain The Right whereof being now vested in ye sd. James Steel These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said James Steel in the Right aforesaid the said Lot of Ground where the same fell by Allotment or as near thereunto as it may be found vacant and also the said proportion of Liberty Land that has not been heretofore Survey'd nor is lawfully claimed by any other person & make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 22^d day of x^{br} Anno Dni. 1727.*
