

By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries bearing Date the 26th day of March Anno. 1733 for Surveying unto James Steel two thousand and four hundred acres of land in this Province Surveyd and Laid out in Part thereof a Tract of Land Situate on Perkiomink Creek in the County of Philadelphia about two miles above the German Tract.

Beginning at a post and running North East by a Line of trees And Crossing the said Creek three hundred and sixteen perch^s to a post. Then by a line of trees North West two hundred sixty five perches to a post. Then South West by a Line of trees Three hundred and sixteen perches to a post Then South East by a line of trees two hundred sixty five perches to the place of Beginning. Containing four hundred ninety two acres with the usual allowance of six per Cent. Surveyd the 13th of April, 1733.

Returned into the Secretary's Office the 28th of August 1733. This Return is Rejected and Supplied by another.
