

Pennsylvania, S. S.

By Vertue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 26th day of March 1733. To Survey to James Steel the quantity of two thousand four hundred acres of land in this Province. There was surveyed on the eighth day of April in the year 1736 unto James Mitchel who obtained a Right to one hundred acres part of the said Quantity, a Tract of land situate in the Townp of Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a post at a corner of the said James Mitchel's other Land & extending thence by the same South fifty seven degrees East one hundred fifty six perches to a Post thence by Nathaniel Litle's land South west by West one hundred & eighteen perches to a black Oak, thence by John Stewart's land North fifty seven degrees West one hundred fifty four perches to a black Oak thence by John Galbreath's land North fifty five degrees East one hundred & eighteen perches to the place of beginning containing one hundred acres & the Allowance of six Acres for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 30th day of July 1741.
