Then resurveyed for Mitchell Isard one tract of Land containing four hundred acres lying on the west side of Chester Creek called weston beginning at the mouth of a small run and running up the s^d run on severall courses 30 perch to a marked Poplar from thence running W S W by a line of marked trees 260 perch to a marked black oak from thence N N W by a line of marked trees 183 perch to a marked black oak from thence E N E: 356 perch to a marked beech standing by Chester Creek Side and from thence down the said Creek on severall courses to the first marked run which run divides the s^d Isards land from the land of W^m Woodmansey which he now dwells upon
