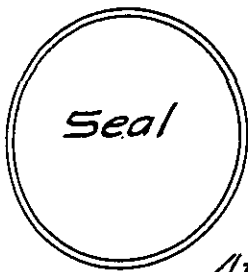


Pensilvania Ss.*By the Commissioners of Property*

At the request of Thomas Shute that we would grant him to take up one hundred & sixty acres of land the remainder of Samuel Allen's original purchase of two thousand acres whose grandson John Sisom to whom ye said one hundred & sixty acres descended by Deeds of Lease & Release datey ye 21st & 22^d dayes of this instant granted & conveyed the said one hundred & sixty acres unto ye said Thomas Shute.

These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Thomas Shute according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred & sixty acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns ~~thereof~~ thereof into the Secretarys office in order for a further confirmation.

Given under our hands and ye Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 30th of ye first moth A.D. 1720.
