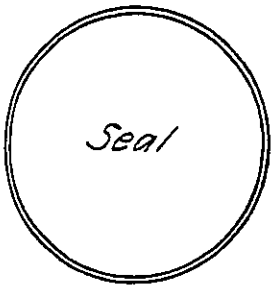


Pennsylvania

At the Request of Joseph Kirt Attorney for William Lovel and James Wood Son of Richard Wood That we would grant them to take up two hundred & twenty five Acres of Land being the Residue not yet taken up of Richard Collins his purchase of twelve hundred and fifty Acres: These are to require thee forthwith to Survey and lay out to the s^d Joseph and James the s^d Number of two hundred and twenty five Acres of Land in this Province not already Survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv^d to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 6th day of the 2^d Moth 1702
